Suit	<u>a set of clothes made from the same cloth, usually a jacket with trousers or a skirt</u>
Underwear	<u>clothing that you wear next to your skin under your other clothes</u>
Pyjamas	<u>comfortable trousers and a shirt that you wear in bed</u>
Slippers	<u>soft comfortable shoes that you wear in your house</u>
Tie	<u>a long narrow piece of cloth that a man wears around his neck under the collar of a shirt. It is tied with a knot</u>
Hat	<u>a piece of clothing that you wear on your head</u>
Dressing gown	<u>a piece of clothing like a long loose coat that you wear in your house</u>
Bra	<u>a piece of underwear that supports a woman's breasts</u>
Tuxedo (US)	<u>a man's black or white jacket worn on formal occasions (=dinner jacket – BE)</u>
Trainers (BE)	<u>strong, comfortable shoes which are designed for doing sports in, but which many people wear as informal clothing (=sneakers – US)</u>
